# Key features of a DGBP project

- Partnership between commercial partner(s) and non-commercial partners. Minimum 1 international commercial partner and one local partner.
- A business opportunity with potential to become commercially viable and scaling-up
- Project and business idea address climate and environmental challenges, and contributes to economic growth and improved livelihoods.
- Strong focus on responsible business conduct by commercial partners

# DGBP contributes to the Sustainable Development Goals

SDG 1, 8, 12, 13 and 17 are at the heart of the DGBP programme.

Depending on the commercial idea of the partnerships, a number of other SDGs can be targeted as well.

Partnerships make an analysis of contribution to the SDGs in the application format for support.



Responsible Business Conduct is a key feature in the DGBP programme. Partnerships are required to conduct initial and continuous screenings of all stakeholders involved in the project using existing and internationally recognized frameworks.

# Who gets funding?

As a challenge fund, DGBP provides funding to the best project applications received based on four overall assessment areas:

- Viability of the business idea
- Development impact potential and additionality
- Feasibility, implementation strategy and capacity of partners
- Coherence and synergy
